Sunday Services

For the seventh summer in a row, Hopedale's Social Justice Committee is planning July Sunday services. Our format is a little less formal than usual, and we'll be changing things up from week to week, including three field trips. But the focus is always on the integration of Hopedale's appreciation of the seasons as they intersect with social justice agendas and local opportunities.

This summer, we are focusing on two UUA Study Action Issues, Escalating Inequality and the Corruption of our Democracy. We are also getting to know each other better and experiencing our local activities and interests, while also connecting with larger UUA agendas. On June 4, we kicked off our reading of J.D. Vance's *Hillbilly Elegy*. *Elegy* is the reading book for Miami University's first-year reading program, and Vance may be on campus for a talk in the fall. The book has gotten mixed reviews, and since Vance is writing about life in Middletown, a conversation about his family's story and Escalating Inequality will be engaging.
